Pattern of Question Paper: Candidates shall be required to answer all the four questions. The question paper shall comprise two sections- Section 'A' and 'B'. In this question, six passages for explanation with reference to context (three from Unit I and three from Unit II), from the prescribed texts shall be set, out of which, the candidate shall have to attempt any **four** passages of 06 marks each. In Section 'B', the candidates shall attempt three long answer type questions of 17 marks each, set on prescribed authors/ texts (one out of two from Unit I, one out of two from Unit II and one out of two from both Unit I and Unit II).

In Section 'B', the candidates shall be required to attempt three long answer type questions of 17 marks each, set on prescribed authors/ texts (one out of two from Unit I, one out of two from Unit II and one out of two from both Unit I and Unit II).
